**Tea with Hezbollah by Ted Dekker & Carl Medearis (DEK)** – is a riveting account of two Americans on a journey, undaunted by threats of personal harm, engagement with militants and kidnapping.

**Running with the Giants by John Maxwell (MAX)** – what the old Testament heroes want you to know about life and leadership – a book that is an answer to the loneliness, discouragement and confusion of leadership.
